





### **Restoration at The Old Lutheran Church**

Work continues on the Tower portion of the structure. Rotted corner boards, siding and sills have been replaced with new structural material. The walls have been wrapped in Tyvek. The contractor will begin resurfacing the tower with siding, mirroring the architectural details that existed in the past. The building has been owned by Franklin Preservation since 2015. We invite you to keep an eye on the project and to consider a donation or attendance at one of our functions. Franklin Preservation received a Keystone Grant for roof replacement which will begin in the spring.



Eight gorgeous Franklin homes will be on display during the Christmas season. Franklin Preservation is offering the event on December 21 from 11AM - 5 PM and December 22 from NOON - 4 PM. There will be a shuttle bus available on both days. Tickets are on sale now at the Franklin Area Chamber of Commerce, The Olive Vault, and online from Eventbrite. Tickets are \$15 prior to the tour and \$18 on the day of the event.

The tour begins at Peddlers and Paddlers Inn on Elk Street where tour participants must exchange their ticket for a tour brochure. The other lovely, historic homes on the tour will be the Koos House, the Heydrick House, the Grant/Joy House, the Dale/Karns House, the Heathcote House, the Beatty House and the Cox House.

Because we are a preservation association, we recognize each house by their original owners names.
